Dr W. Lawrence S. Prabhakar is a Visiting Research Fellow in the Institute of Defence and Strategic Studies, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore (August 2004-February 2005). He will be working on the project “Competitive and Cooperative Maritime Strategies of US, Japan, China and India: Interactions and Implications for South East Asia”.

He is Associate Professor of Political Science Madras Christian College, Chennai (Madras). He graduated with MA and MPhil Degrees in Political Science from the Madras Christian College. His doctoral work was on “Strategic Thought in India Since 1971” which he earned as PhD from the Department of Defence & Strategic Studies University of Madras.

Dr. Prabhakar is Consultant to the Directorate of Net Assessment Office of the Chiefs of Integrated Defence Staff, Chiefs of Staff Committee, Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India on with three projects: i) “The Role of the Dragon: Strategic Role and Posture of China in the India-Pakistan Conflict Spectrum” in the Simulation-cum-Scenario Development Exercise: India-Pakistan Conflict Spectrum Under the Nuclear Backdrop at the Army War College, Mhow (February 2003); ii) “Extra-regional Naval Presence and Posture: Implications for the Indian Navy” in the Project Regional Maritime Balance in Indian Ocean 2020” (July 2003); and iii) “Escalation Dynamics Based on Nuclear Doctrines and Force Postures in Southern Asia” (March 2004).

His other forthcoming publication is on India and the Ballistic Missile Defenses to forthcoming four-volume “The Scribner’s Encyclopedia of India” to be co-edited by Stanley Wolpert and Raju Thomas Scribners-Gale-Thomson, New York (2004).

Dr Prabhakar is Visiting Faculty to the Defense Services Staff College Wellington India and to the College of Naval Warfare, Karanja Mumbai, Army War College, Mhow Indore, Officers Training Academy; an alumni /Resource Person/ project consultant to the Regional Center for Strategic Studies Colombo Sri Lanka. A media commentator on Strategic Affairs; his regular contributions and analysis on South Asian Strategic affairs feature in renowned websites.

His earlier research fellowships have been Visiting Fellow, The Henry Stimson Center, Washington DC USA, where he worked on “The Draft Indian Nuclear Doctrine: Perspectives of Regional & Global Nuclear Powers” May-August 2001. In this stint, he also worked on “Indian Security Perspectives of the PLA Navy in South Asia” for the Center for Naval Analysis, Alexandria Virginia USA.

His other presentations have been on “Small Arms Proliferation in South Asia: An Indian Perspective” in the Study Group on Small Arms in South Asia as part of the UN Conference on Small Arms July 2001, Manhattan New York. He had

presented on India's Strategic Culture and India's Nuclear Doctrine in the Roundtables at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs, Harvard University, July 2001.

His most recent publications include "The Challenge of Minimal Nuclear Deterrence" (2002); "The Maritime Strategic Perspectives of the PLA Navy in South Asia-Indian Ocean Region" (2003); "Asymmetric Warfare and the New War: Implications for Policy and Strategy" (2002); and "India's Case for a Limited Missile Defense" (2002): His research projects include "Air power and Indian Security"; and "Ballistic Missile Proliferation in South Asia and the Middle East: A Comparative Analysis".
