

## **Tan Tai Yong**

Tan Tai Yong is the Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, National University of Singapore (NUS). He is also an Assoc Professor in the Department of History in the Faculty, and Acting Director of the Institute of South Asian Studies.

Assoc Professor Tan has published extensively on South and Southeast Asian history and his most recent book, "The Garrison State: Civil-Military Relations in Colonial Punjab", is due out in March 2005. Assoc Professor Tan is active in local and international conferences, seminars, public talks and lectures. His present research interests are port cities in Asia and the South Asian Diaspora networks.

Assoc Professor Tan has held visiting appointments at the Wolfson College and Centre for South Asian Studies, Cambridge University (1999) and the British Academy, Wellcome Trust Centre of the History of Medicine, University College London (2003). His academic awards include the British Academy Visiting Professor (2003), Moncado Prize, Society of Military History, USA (2001), Overseas Commonwealth Fellowship (1999), Teaching Excellence Award, NUS (1992 and 2000), Shell Medal in History, NUS (1986) and Straits Steamship Book Prize (1985).

Assoc Professor Tan is a member of the Editorial Boards of the Journal of Southeast Asian Studies (Cambridge), India Review (USA) and the International Journal of Punjab Studies (UK) as well as an Editorial Consultant with Orient Longman Monograph Series on Imperialism in Asia (India). His public/social service includes the Chairmanship of the Singapore History Museum and membership in the Management Board of the Institute of South Asian Studies, the Board of Governors of the Institute of Defence and Strategic Studies, National Archives of Singapore Board and the National Heritage Board.

Assoc Professor Tan received his PhD from Cambridge University in 1992. He received his MA in 1989 and BA Honours (First Class) in 1986 from the National University of Singapore.
